

Christmas Cards – Crayon Resist

Supplies

Ranger Products:

Distress Inks

Archival Ink

White Glossy Cardstock

Cut n Dry Foam

Other Products:

White wax crayon

Stamps

Punch

Tim Holtz Tissue Tape

Blank Music Sheet Paper (or other vintage paper)

Rhinestones



Step 1: Stamp images on Glossy Cardstock with Archival Ink.



Using white crayon cover the areas of image that you want to resist the ink when applied.

Step 2: Using a piece of cut n dry foam apply Distress Ink(s) to image. The areas that are covered with the crayon will resist the ink. You can also use a paper towel or cloth to rub over the image to remove any excess ink.





Step 3: To give the music sheet paper an “aged” look, crumple paper then smooth out. Tear edges. Use a piece of cut n dry foam to apply distress ink to paper. Ink edges with a coordinating colored ink.



Step 4: Cut glossy card with stamped image to desired size. Assemble cards using pre-made card form (or you can fold your own), stamped image, tissue tape, music sheet and rhinestones.



On the “Peace” card I edged the music paper with red ink and the card form with green ink. I also punched the bottom of the image with an edge punch to give it some more detail. Added the tissue tape and accented with rhinestones.



On the “Santa” card I edged the music paper with green and the card form with red. I punched the edge of the top flap of the card and added tissue tape to the both the top and bottom flaps of the card. Stamped a sentiment and accented with rhinestones.
